

## **Transitional Arrangements**

## 1. Introduction

In November 2017 intake on to the Costs Lawyer Qualification was suspended. In July 2018 all existing students were notified that the ACLT Costs Lawyer Qualification had to be withdrawn and of the applicable timings to complete the qualification.

January 2020 will see the re-introduction of the qualification, but the qualification will have a new structure. The introduction of the new structure will have implications for students who are already studying the qualification under the existing structure.

## 2. Delivery of the existing structure

The table below is the timetable for the final delivery of the existing structure qualification. Any students that do not complete the existing structure components by the dates set out below may need to apply for exemptions before qualifying via the new structure.

## 3. Exemption applications

For all students who do not complete their qualification under the existing structure, it is open to those students to make applications for exemptions based upon the completion of modules on that structure from modules or units on the new structure. Any applications for exemptions should be made in accordance with the ACLT exemption application policy however the non complete qualification rule will not apply in respect of these exemptions.
